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Dear SIS-Adma families,

Term 2 started very positively regardless of the challenging times we encountered in Term 1. Our teams of educators remained focused on helping our students regain their motivation and drive towards academic success and personal development. I am very thankful that we have managed to finalize Term 2 learning just before the school closure amid the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) pandemic, and grateful to our diverse teams that have been extensively and tirelessly working on swiftly developing new E-learning tools using different digital platforms.

Our academic team has guaranteed a comprehensive revision week. However, since our top priority is the safety and well-being of our students, we found ourselves compelled to cancel Term 2 final exams.

On a positive note, our SLO® prefects had a very busy Term 2 with over 50 events, once more, proving to be one of our strongest pillars at SIS-Adma. As always, the various SLO® departments, driven by our core values of honesty and integrity, principles and hard work, as well as quality and efficiency, worked in collaboration to ensure that prefects left their mark and made a difference in every task and project they took on.

The biggest part of activities within Term 2 revolved around highlighting our students' academic and non-academic talents. Enthusiasm surrounding the SABIS® STARS auditions and selections was high, with many students applying to represent SIS-Adma in the Poetry, Spelling Bee, Advertising, Creative Writing, Public Speaking, Science Fair, Debate, Painting, Singing, Photography, and our World Our Concern competitions. Through these competitions, we were able to discover several hidden talents, which made it very difficult to choose the final winners who will make us proud and represent us in Term 1 of the coming school year.

Our faith in our students is unwavering, especially when it comes to a program as important as the LAU MUN program. Our student advisors were able to train and guide their delegations on several important aspects such as confidence, posture, tone, eye contact, and content knowledge. This dedication is what allowed both our middle and high school delegates to shine in the final conferences and win following awards: best improved, position paper, diplomacy, and secretary general.

In addition to all the focus on academics, Term 2 highlighted the importance of health – physical, emotional, and nutritional. A "Health Week" was conducted to educate students from KG up to Grade 12 on the value of our health, and the impact good health has on our life. Topics such as tobacco awareness, substance abuse, cyber safety, the importance of sleep, dental health, proper posture, and healthy nutrition were all covered during that week. A spice of fun was added to those topics with the inclusion of record-setting physical fitness competitions, SLO® fun games, teachers versus students matches, and a mega Zumba dance.

Even with major events taking place, prefects were always diligently working within their departments to ensure constant improvement: The Outdoor prefects regularly watched over students during break time to guarantee that they are safe and happy. The Discipline prefects constantly ensured that SABIS® values and principles were implemented at all times. The Outreach Department prefects surprised everyone on campus by putting new SLO® bookmarks on their desks; they also encouraged students to display their gratitude towards life with a writing activity. The Lower School Department prefects are frequently coming up with clubs and events such as a spelling bee for grades 1 to 3 students; we noticed that the number of students joining those clubs in Term 2 has significantly increased.

The Social Responsibility prefects' mission to contribute positively to their community was fulfilled this term. Green Initiative campaigns such as Meatless Monday and Lights Out Day helped the school community make a direct impact on the environment. Prefects also organized a tree-planting trip that resulted in a hundred trees being planted in an area devastated by fire. Money was also raised for the Saint Katerina convent in order to provide essential supplies to the orphans and underprivileged girls in the convent. In addition to the aforementioned, Social Responsibility prefects helped raise money for the Red Cross and the Children's Cancer Center of Lebanon through a bracelet sale on the World Cancer Awareness Day.

On the P.E. front, we managed, with a joint effort from AQC's, teachers, parents and the P.E. department, to encourage more students to join swimming lessons. This allowed us to identify many little future champions; we hope to grow our pool of participants even more. Moreover, several games have been carried out with the active participation of our alumni who demonstrated their love and belonging to their school community. We also participated in the Lebanese Schools Championship for athletics and under-12 football. Nine of our teams reached the finals in Keserwan – Jbeil area. However, the final matches were cancelled because of the Coronavirus situation.

Finally, I would like to share with you our latest success stories! Five of our students have received one or more awards from the Center of Educational Research and Development (CRDP) for high performance in The Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) for Scientific, Mathematical or Reading Literacy. Additionally, we have registered impressive SAT scores that ranged between 1500 and 1570 and some of our students have succeeded in gaining early acceptance in major universities such as Imperial College, University of Edinburgh, University of Bristol, University of Manchester, UCL, King's College, and IE Madrid,

Term 3 has already proven to be special by all means. We launched successfully our comprehensive e-learning program in which all our students from Preschool through grade 12 are participating actively. Despite all the challenges paused by distance learning, our students are being able to attend virtual classes on Microsoft® Teams, interact with their teachers, work on their assignments, and test their knowledge using different e-assessment platforms.

We will surely have plenty to tell about this experience in the Term 3 newsletter. We hope that soon we will be able to meet again because you have been dearly missed. Until then, please stay safe!

## Lebanese Reforestation Initiative Tree Planting Trip

As part of the reforestation and restoring of burnt areas initiative in Nahr El Kalb, around 40 students from SIS-Adma planted a total of 100 pine seedlings and carobs in Deir Mar Elias-Jeita. The deforested area burnt down in 2016, and due to the severity of the fire, no natural degeneration took place. The LRI team trained the students on appropriate planting practices, and raised awareness on fire protection and safety. The LRI implemented the activity through the “Livelihoods in Forestry” (LIF) project, which is funded by USAID, in collaboration with SIS-Adma, Jeita Municipality, and the local community.
